Cervivor School

Cervivor School is a life-changing and empowering opportunity. Many survivors feel that becoming a Cervivor School graduate gives them both a voice and the motivation to become more of an active advocate on behalf of Cervivor.

Cervivor School isn't for everyone. Although it is a wonderful few days of meeting and connecting with other survivors, the focus of the school is to transition you from patient to advocate. Those who are ready to take their survivorship to the next level are the ideal candidates.

At Cervivor School, you will learn from HPV and cervical cancer experts. You will understand what messages are important to share, the science behind the vaccine and screening tests, how to live with side effects of treatment, how to make your survivorship count, and much more.

Cervivor Schools are held once a year in different locations throughout the U.S. and even abroad. Individuals impacted by cervical cancer are encouraged to apply to our school as soon as we open the application process, as our schools do fill up.



Cervical Cancer Facts

- Cervical cancer is the **4th most common cancer** in people with a cervix worldwide.
- Each year, more than **660,000** individuals are diagnosed with cervical cancer, and more than **350,000** die from the disease worldwide (World Health Organization 2022).
- In the U.S., more than **13,360** new cases of invasive cervical cancer are diagnosed, and more than **4,320** individuals die from the disease each year (American Cancer Society 2025 Facts & Figures).
- **American Indian and Alaska Native** individuals are nearly twice as likely to develop cervical cancer compared to white individuals and are four times as likely to die from cervical cancer.
- **Asian Americans** have the lowest rates of cervical cancer collectively but if you look at their subgroups, they have a higher incidence rate of cervical cancer.
- **Black** individuals are more likely to die of cervical cancer than any other group.
- **Latine/Hispanic** individuals have one of the highest rates of cervical cancer and the second-highest rate of deaths related to cervical cancer.
- **50 percent** of those diagnosed with cervical cancer have never been screened.
- Cervical cancer is **almost always preventable** through routine screenings. Please check with your healthcare provider to stay up-to-date on the current guidelines.
- In addition to preventing cervical cancer, screening can detect invasive cancer early, when treatment is usually less intensive and more successful.
- HPV, the cause of nearly all cervical cancers, can be prevented when youth are vaccinated against the virus.
